Those with special needs may be considered for a full travel honorarium. **Participants who receive travel funds are required to attend both days of the workshop.**

"Pitches" Poster Session: This session is ideal for special topic items such as interesting macro analysis applications, unique assignments and projects for students, innovative teaching techniques, or student presentations. "Pitches" session presentations are fifteen minutes in length with five minutes for questions. Please submit a short abstract (150–250 words) describing the poster content and format. Traditional Poster Session:

Anyone attending the workshop is invited to bring a standard poster or handouts to display during the workshop. Please submit a short abstract (150–250 words) describing the poster content and format. **DEADLINE: April 16, 2016.**

Evaluation of All Submissions

Submissions will be evaluated based on the description and presentation of the session in the abstract. While we welcome topics on all aspects of music, we encourage those proposals with a discernable link between the topic and macro analysis. Session topics that involve any active participation of the workshop audience are also encouraged.
