Travel Reimbursement

The Macro Analysis Creative Research Organization provides three different levels of support for our member needs. These honorariums help to cover the costs incurred by members attending our Musician's Workshop.

Three levels of travel honorarium support are now available:

- 1. \$250 of travel money for those attending the workshop.
- 2. Up to \$500 of support for those presenting either a poster or session at the workshop.
- 3. The Gene Benward Memorial Travel Honorarium.

All travel honorariums can be used only for MACRO-related travel to our Musician's Workshop at Madison, Wisconsin. Travel honorariums may also be awarded in special cases for other workshops and conferences if you are presenting macro-analytical material at that meeting.

Travel honorariums are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, so if at all possible, requests for travel funds should be submitted online by May 1 in the year of the workshop <www.macromusic.org/applications/travelreimbursement.html>.
